




(STAR Program)

historical data, real-time trends and individual state needs. In 2018, **36 states** participated, **an increase of six** over 2017.

STAR based initiatives directly impacted more than **68,662** individuals.





Curriculum for Agricultural Science Education

Scholarships & Grants Awarded

- CHS Foundation supported **55 partial** scholarships
- Firestone supported **4 partial scholarships** for the Mechanical Systems in Agriculture course
- Association of Equipment Manufacturers in partnership with the Equipment Dealers Association funded **32 partial scholarships** for the Agricultural Power and Technology and Mechanical Systems in Agriculture courses
- Farm Credit East awarded **9 partial scholarships**
- DuPont Pioneer funded **122 teachers** and pre-service teacher education programs and provided \$267,200 in grants
- USDA Professional Development Opportunity for Secondary School Teachers (PD-STEP) funded **22 teachers** to participate as a cohort in the two-year CASE Pathway Adoption Grant Program
- In total, **244 scholarships and grants** were awarded this year

CASE (Curriculum for Agricultural Science Education) is committed to **improving** educational experiences for agriculture students by empowering agriculture **teachers**. CASE is an initiative of The National Council for Agricultural Education and managed by the National Association of Agricultural Educators. Curriculum includes detailed instructions, assessments, rubrics, hands-on activities, projects, and problems with each lesson. CASE professional development enhances the level of STEM education in agriculture classroom.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

National Agriscience Teacher Ambassador Program

NAAE's National Agriscience Teacher Ambassador Program is a multi-faceted program that provides trainings on several different levels that offer teachers the opportunity to receive agriscience specific training through inquiry-based and science rigor instruction and opens the door to new and improved agricultural education.

National Agriscience Teacher Ambassador Academy (NATAA)

- Serves as a train the trainer program
- \cdot 2018 academy trained **19 teachers** with **50 hours** of professional development received by each teacher
- In 16 years, **383 Ambassadors** have been trained
- 2018 Ambassadors positively affected **over 10,000 students** during the year
- 98% of trained Ambassadors remain in the profession (2% have retired)

NAAE Agriscience Inquiry Institutes (Ag I²)

- State level institutes that focus on training teachers within their home states utilizing trained Ambassadors
- NAAE Agriscience Inquiry Institute
- **81 teachers** and **1.335 hours** of CEUs were earned by teachers as part of the NAAE Agriscience Inquiry Institutes
- 21 workshops across 12 states reaching 300+ teachers were conducted on the local and state level by trained Ambassadors

National Agriscience Preservice Teacher Program (NAPTP)

• 124 preservice agricultural education students were NAPTP trained as part of the National Agriscience Preservice Teacher Program Program and the Future Agriscience Teacher Symposium (FAST)



Annual Symposium of National Agriscience Teacher Ambassadors

- Continuing education for Ambassadors focused on the newest Agriscience teaching innovations
- 72 Ambassadors participated in continuing education earning 216 hours of CEUs

In 2018, **384 teachers attended** at least one NAAE Agriscience Learning Lab held at Teachers' World at National FFA Convention, NAAE Convention, National Science Teachers' Association Conference, and Regional National Science Teachers' Association Conference

- **450+ hours** of CEUs were earned by participants















XLR8 Program

NAAE's XLR8 National Professional Development Program focuses on providing mid-career teachers the tools and support they need to grow and flourish in their career. The overall goal of the program is to train and promote quality well-balanced teacher leaders who will remain in the profession of teaching agriculture.

2017-2018 Highlights:

- 22 teachers participated in the national cohort
- 119 teachers have participated since the introduction of program in 2013 with a **98% retention rate**
- 4 State/Regional Institutes were held with 85 additional teachers trained
- Teachers participated in **14 hours** of specifically designed professional development sessions with topics including:
 - Balancing work and family life
 - Reducing stress
 - Teaching with Your Strengths
 - Health and Wellness
